

The BSMT New Media Program (NMP) presents [Flatland](#), a group exhibition of seventeen artists exploring new technologies. Spanning five storefronts of Downtown Miami, transformed into five conceptual levels—Dissociation, Liminality, Other Worlds, Resurface, and Flatland—the exhibition leads visitors on a cognitive journey of many dimensions. Using machine vision, biometric sensors, anamorphic 3D projection mapping, VR, AR, and more, the works in the show invite one to dissociate momentarily from ordinary waking consciousness, and explore the worlds of seventeen artists who imagine new perspectives of "reality". Fear not, for the journey ends back where one started, in a world we shall call Flatland.
